## MONMOUTH-OCEAN EDUCATIONAL SERVICES COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY BUDGET ADOPTION

## **Presentation of Budget**

Dr. Beams presented the budget via video presentation to all members of the Representative Assembly of Monmouth and Ocean County. The budget information was transmitted to the members of the Representative Assembly electronically and members were asked if they had any questions.

## **Discussion**

Mr. Steven LaValva, Spring Lake Boro, asked a question regarding the 75% transportation fee being charged in the first bill and what would happen if districts cancelled the route. Dr. Beams explained that MOESC completes most of the services or work required to process, coordinate, route, procure, and contract the route before the route begins. This percentage of just the administrative fee will be charged to ensure MOESC is paid for the service they provide.
